THE 6 PILLARS OF DOG TRAINING WISDOM: DEFIN

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A GUIDE BY... A Better Pet

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1. Distractions:

Things in the environment that cause the dog not to pay attention. Can be visual, auditory, olfactory and vibrational. Also knows as the Four (4) S's of Socialization: Sights, Sounds, Scents, Surfaces.

2. Distance:

The measure the dog is from you or a distraction or both at the same time. Inches, feet, yards, etc.

3. Duration:

A measure of time. How long or short something lasts. *NOTE: THESE ARE QUANTIFIERS, NOT QUALIFIERS.

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4. Structure:

A period of time with a beginning, middle and an end. Can be short, medium or long in duration.

5.Management:

Tangible things⁶that help manage a dog. Conventional things include leashes, collars, harnesses, crates, gates, fences. Unconventional includes things like snow, brick walls, a sofa or aisles in a grocery store.

6. Training:

The cues and default behaviors you teach your dog to understand.
